OUR HISTORY & MISSION

40 Years of Advancing Educational Equity

From Bridge-Builder to Bold Innovator

For 40 years, the Boston Education Fund (BEDF) has been a steadfast partner in ensuring that Boston Public Schools (BPS) students and educators have access to the resources they need to thrive. Established in 1984, BEDF was founded to bridge the funding gap between public education budgets and the additional investments needed to elevate student success.

Over four decades, BEDF has transitioned from a traditional funding conduit into a dynamic force for educational equity. What began as a means to complement school budgets has evolved into a mission-driven organization that leverages philanthropy, corporate partnerships, and grassroots community engagement to drive systemic change.

In 2021, we reintroduced ourselves to the community and the nation under a new name and with a new vision. Transitioning from the Boston Educational Development Foundation to operating as the Boston Education Fund, we adopted a brand that better reflects our identity: a bold, modern, and equity-centered catalyst for education.

Our Evolution Under New Leadership

In 2021, BEDF entered a new chapter, embracing a bold vision for sustainable, equity-driven philanthropy under the leadership of Pamela Leins. In the past 4 years, we have:

- Launched EdQuity Boston, a pioneering initiative that centers community-led philanthropy and equity in funding decisions, and introduced a \$10M campaign to drive lasting change.
- Expanded fundraising efforts, securing record-breaking investments for BPS students.
- Strengthened partnerships with educators, donors, and corporate leaders to amplify impact.
- Increased transparency & equity in resource allocation, ensuring funds reach the schools and programs that need them most.
- Established three major community events throughout the year to connect, uplift, celebrate, and fundraise.
- Rebranded to reflect better our values, mission, and position within the national philanthropic landscape.

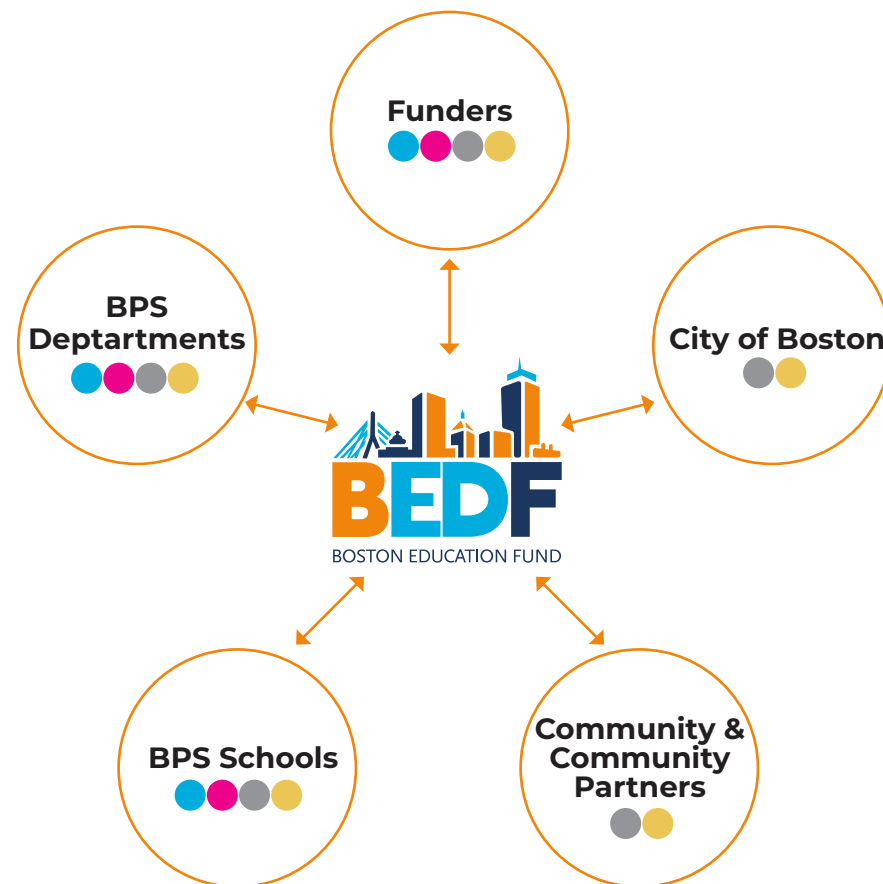


The Connector & Community Builder

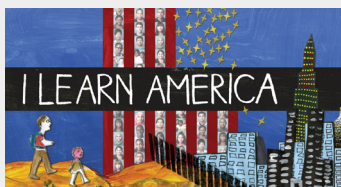

From a Bold Idea to a Replicable Model

Centering Equity. Centering Community.

EdQuity Boston was born from the deep belief that our communities—educators, families, students—should not only be heard, but be trusted to lead. In 2021, BEDF initiated intentional community listening sessions that brought together BPS educators, grassroots organizers, youth leaders, and parents. What we heard was clear: traditional philanthropy often falls short because it overlooks the lived experiences of those it aims to help.

So we launched EdQuity Boston—a movement for community-led, equity-centered philanthropy. Through this initiative, decision-making power is returned to those on the ground. We are reimagining how funds are distributed by centering community decision-making, so that those most impacted by educational inequities have greater power in shaping how resources are allocated.

The pilot phases will distribute small grants based on community priorities, leading to the development of new programming in mental health, culturally relevant curricula, youth leadership development, and other initiatives.

Now, we're scaling this effort. With the launch of our \$10M campaign, we're building a national model that proves what happens when you lead with trust.

EdQuity Boston is more than a program—it's a paradigm shift. And it's just getting started.

Why We Exist

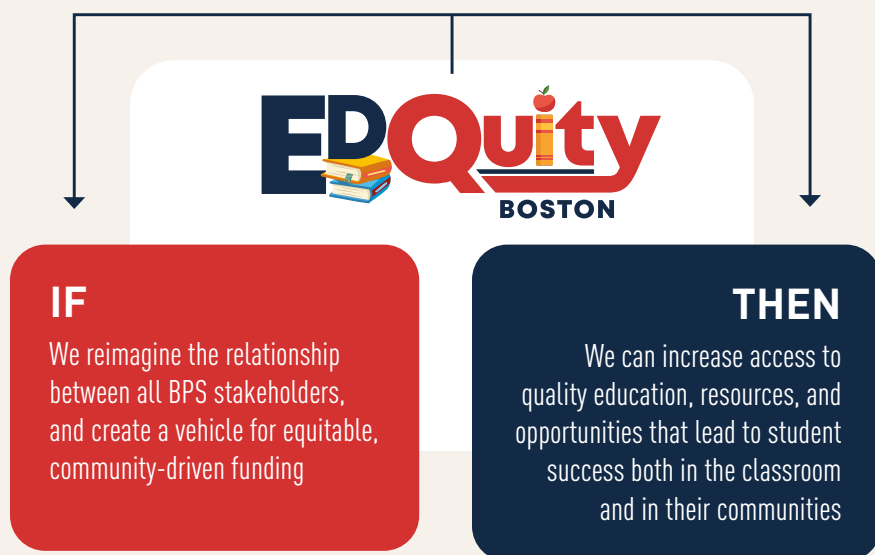
Boston's education system continues to experience systemic inequities, disproportionately affecting students of color, low-income families, and under-resourced schools. Traditional funding mechanisms often fail to directly engage communities, resulting in investments that are misaligned with the needs of those most affected. Public funding is typically rigid, slow-moving, and politically constrained, resulting in critical needs going unmet.

EdQuity Boston's Vision: What We Aim to Achieve

All Boston Public Schools students, particularly those from historically marginalized communities, receive equitable access to high-quality education, resources, and opportunities. EdQuity Boston transforms philanthropy into a community-driven, equity-centered model that complements BPS's funding and empowers educators, students, and families to make informed decisions.
